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Gujarat Govt Launches Scheme Offering Affordable Rented Homes For Labourers

Additional housing centres will be set up throughout Gujarat aimed at accommodating around 3 lakh construction workers. The project is expected to cost ₹ 1,500 crore, the chief minister said. July 18, 2024: In a move that will benefit the thousands of labourers, the Gujarat government has launched the Shramik Basera scheme to provide temporary housing to nearly 15,000 construction workers at a rent of ₹ 5 per day. The chief minister Bhupendrabhai Patel performed the ground-breaking ceremony of 17 dwelling structures to house the workers in Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar, Vadodara and Rajkot, as per an official release.

According to the release, the chief minister also launched an online portal for the Shramik Basera scheme. During his address at the event, he said the scheme will benefit around 15,000 construction workers once the facilities are ready. Accommodation will be given to them for a daily rent of ₹ 5 per person. Additional housing centres will be set up throughout Gujarat aimed at accommodating around 3 lakh construction workers. The project is expected to cost ₹ 1,500 crore, he added. The initiative is aimed at bringing about a 'qualitative change' in the standard of living of workers from the unorganised sector and construction workers by providing them with food, health, housing and financial support, he said.

New Housing Project At Nakshatrwadi In Maharashtra Under PMAY

The Maharashtra state government will build 1056 new homes at Nakshatrwadi in Chhatrapati Sambhaji Nagar under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana. This announcement was made by the State Housing Minister Atul Save in Chhatrapati Sambhaji Nagar. At the District Collector's office, Atul Save conducted a computerized lottery to allocate 1133 homes and 361 available plots in Chhatrapati Sambhaji Nagar, as well as in Latur, Jalna, Nanded, Hingoli, Parbhani, and Dharashiv. These homes and plots were developed under various housing schemes managed by MHADA's Chhatrapati Sambhaji Nagar Board.

Atul Save explained that the new housing project at Nakshatrwadi will include modern amenities at par with the private developers. He added that the soon the bhoomipujan ceremony for this project will happen soon. Atul Save congratulated the board's Chief Officer, Mandar Vaidya, and his team for organizing the lottery well and wished the applicant's good luck.

The computerized lottery for the 1133 homes and 361 plots was conducted in four phases. In the first phase, the lottery was held for 957 applications received for 425 homes under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana, with Suresh Bansode being the first winner. District Collector Dilip Swami, Board Chief Officer Mandar Vaidya, and Board Deputy Chief Engineer Kishor Kumar Katavate were also present at the event. Many citizens watched the live broadcast of the lottery through MHADA's webcasting service.

plots have been allotted through e-auction, Yeida officials said, adding that in such an auction, the plot is sold to the one who places the highest bid against the reserve price.

"We floated a scheme in June this year offering two plots for group housing to realtors interested in building housing projects along the Yamuna Expressway, near the greenfield airport project. Two realtors participated in the e-bidding process for each group housing plot. And the realtor who placed the highest bid got the plots in accordance with rules," said Arun Vir Singh, chief executive officer, Yeida.

Yeida offered a 40,000 square metre plot for group housing in Sector 22D and another plot measuring 20,000 square metre in the same sector. Purvanchal Projects Private Limited placed the highest bid of ₹ 149.57 crore for the plot measuring 40,000 square metres and secured the rights to the plot. ACE Infracity Developers Private Limited placed the second highest bid of ₹ 142.45 crore.

DLF to Enter New Markets of Goa & Mumbai

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Lucknow Metro's East-West Corridor Gets NPG Approval



NPG approves Lucknow Metro's East-West Corridor, connecting Charbagh to Vasant Kunj. Project cost estimated at ₹ 5,081 crore, with 12 stations.

In a big boost to public transport in the state capital, the Network Planning Group (NPG) under the PM Gati Shakti-National Master Plan for Multi-modal Connectivity has approved the detailed project report (DPR) for Lucknow Metro's East West Corridor. The NPG approves the technical feasibility of all railway and highway projects in the country. Estimated to cost ₹ 5,081 crore, the project got the NPG's nod when it met in Delhi on Tuesday. The meeting was chaired by the additional secretary of the Department of Industrial Policy Promotion (File)

The East-West corridor aims to connect Charbagh to Vasant Kunj and will be crucial for the state capital's Old City area. Estimated to cost ₹ 5,081 crore, the project got the NPG's nod when it met in Delhi on Tuesday. The meeting was chaired by the additional secretary of the Department of Industrial Policy Promotion.

The meeting held to discuss several projects found no obstacle in giving the go-ahead to the East-West Corridor.

According to a Uttar Pradesh Metro Rail Corporation official, "The NPG meeting included representatives from departments such as housing and urban affairs, defence, railways, environment and forests, and finance. Following the NPG, the next major phase is a nod from the Public Investment Board."

The proposed East-West Corridor will have a total length of 11.165 kilometres (4.286 km elevated and 6.879 km underground). It will include a total of 12 stations seven of which will be underground. The estimated completion time for this proposed corridor is five years. The East-West corridor will connect to the existing North-South corridor at the Charbagh Metro station, which will serve as an interchange station.

UPMRC managing director Sushil Kumar said the approval of the East-West Corridor by the NPG was a significant step and the project was crucial for urban transportation in Lucknow as well as for the existing metro corridor.

Union Budget 2024-25: 1 crore homes to get free electricity up to 300 units under Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana, announces Finance Minister

In line with the Interim Budget announcement in February this year, Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Tuesday announced the launch of Pradhan Mantri-Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana (PM Free Electricity scheme), to promote rooftop solar (RTS) installations in India by providing one crore households with free electricity for up to 300 units every month. Announced a slew of measures for the promotion of green growth and renewable energy, the Finance Minister said in her Budget 2024 speech, "The rooftop solar scheme has generated remarkable response with over 1.28 crore registrations and 14 lakh applications."

A ₹75,021-crore package for the scheme was approved by the previous government in February this year. An official press release stated that the Centre wiould fund 60% of the cost for installing for 2 kW (kilowatt) systems and 40% of the cost for systems from 2-3 kW capacity.

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman created history as she presented her seventh straight Budget and the first Budget by the BJP-led NDA government since it was re-elected last month. Ms. Sitharaman tabled the Economic Survey of the financial year 2024 in the Lok Sabha on Monday. The Survey projected India's financial year 2025 Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth to range between 6.5% and 7%. The growth projected for 2024-25 is lower than the economic growth rate of 8.2% estimated for the previous financial year.

Waaree's scope of work under the project includes designing, engineering, procurement, bifacial solar modules supply, installation, procuring land, and managing the entire construction and commissioning of the solar plant. The scope also includes comprehensive operations and maintenance. Furthermore, the project includes installing evacuation infrastructure at both plant and substation levels, establishing the necessary transmission lines, and obtaining all regulatory approvals to ensure smooth operations.

Adani Solar Launches 575 W TOPCon Bifacial PV Module

Adani Solar has unveiled a new bifacial solar module utilising tunnel oxide passivated contact (TOPCon) cell technology as part of its Shine series. These modules incorporate cells produced domestically by Adani, adhering to the domestic content requirement set by the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy for solar power projects. Available in power ranges



from 550 W to 575 W, with efficiencies ranging from 21.4 per cent to 22.4 per cent, these 144-cell bifacial panels have an open-circuit voltage ranging from 50.2 V to 51.2 V and a short-circuit current of 13.87 A to 14.17 A. They feature a transparent backsheet on the rear side and weigh 28 kg, measuring 2,266 mm x 1,133 mm. Built with 182 mm (M10), 16BB half-cut cells, these panels can operate with a maximum system voltage of 1,500 V. They exhibit a temperature coefficient (Pmax) of -0.31 per cent per degree Celsius and are operational within a temperature range of -40 °C to 85 °C. Adani Solar provides a 12-year product warranty and a 30year performance warranty for these panels, with a first-year degradation rate of 1 per cent. Narsighar House Nokha, Rajasthan

Most of the houses & palaces built in this region for centuries had courtyards for passive cooling, thick stone walls to combat the excessive heat and stone 'jali' screens to mitigate heat gain.

Situated in the arid desert region of Nokha in Rajasthan the Narsighar house imbibes the traditional planning principles of the regional architecture prevalent since centuries in Rajasthan. Most of the houses & palaces built in this region since centuries had courtyards for passive cooling, thick stone walls to combat the excessive heat & stone 'jali' screens to mitigate heat gain.

The Narsighar house is punctuated with a series of courtyards & built in the local sandstone available in the

immediate vicinity. Each of the living spaces open into sheltered outdoor spaces screened with perforated stone panels. These screens in addition to reducing heat gain also protect the inner spaces from the sandstorms prevalent in the region. The home based on the clients needs to accommodate 4 generations has 9 bedrooms with multifunctional living spaces, sheltered courtyards & patios all around.

In addition to the traditional planning principles, elements of traditional Rajasthan architecture, including multifoil arched windows, patterned stone screens, stone pergolas, inlay work & carving work, accentuate the spaces. Rajasthan in India is home to many craftsmen, including stone carving, marble inlay, carpentry work, mirror work inlay, lime plaster, and more. The entire house was executed & worked upon by these local craftsmen, reviving many traditional techniques.

Although the house appears large, over 40% of the area is in the form of open courtyards, circulation spaces and







sheltered outdoor patios. Each volume is articulated individually with the home being perceived as a composition of varying volumes. An entry car porch opens into a sunlit courtyard that leads to a sheltered stone arcade flanked by water troughs and gardens for passive cooling before one enters the house. The skylit entrance lobby within the house is flanked by a living room & an open seating area & leads one into a large central courtyard.

The main courtyard punctuating the house is naturally ventilated through clear-story windows, with the circulation skirting its perimeter. Sectionally, there is a flow of different volumes within. Most of the rooms are 4M high, with the main living room 6.5M high, the central courtyard 12M high, the north & south courtyards 8M high, and the outdoor patios 3.6M high. Every living space & bedroom in the house opens into sheltered outdoor spaces, creating transitional volumes between the inside & the outside to mitigate heat gain.

Indirect sunlight permeates all the spaces filtered through arches or stone screens, creating different shadow patterns throughout the day. This house was designed with traditional principles & materials for passive cooling with

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contract labor from the nearby villages, stone from the vicinity, craftsmen from the region & all materials sourced locally. The marble, stone, wood, lime plaster & furniture are all procured from Rajasthan.

Designed contextual to the climate, location & heritage of the region Narsighar revives the Indian traditional planning principles and revives traditional crafts, creating an energy efficient home built to last for centuries, for future generations.

What was once considered a disadvantaged neighborhood is now seen as an attractive place to live and work. Waag Woensel-West symbolizes the completion of many unique and long-term projects for the neighborhood. The building is a key part of the new image that the neighborhood's main street, the infamous Edisonstraat, is intended to portray.

It also marks the completion of the new building project Plan Celcius, based on the original and affordable Da Vinci modular housing concept. Furthermore, it forms the centerpiece of the new square, the final stage of the transformation. The main aim of the project was to create an easily accessible facility for and by the residents of the neighborhood. The first plans for the revitalization of Woensel-West were drawn up by the various parties involved at the beginning of this century. The cooperation between the municipality and the housing company Trudo initiated a joint development process that continues to this day. The company and the municipality wanted to develop the neighborhood together but with different approaches. In a joint decision, priority was given to adopting a communitybased approach.

This approach aimed to renovate the housing in the neighborhood, build a school, and provide incentives for small business owners in order to make Edisonstraat a lively and attractive street again. Since investing in local residents requires a high level of human and resource support,









priority was given to those who wanted to help develop neighborhood activities when allocating the social housing developed by Trudo.

In order to ensure that all interventions in the spatial structure of the neighbourhood have something to offer to the existing residents, the primary goal is to invest in the future of the residents. This is a different and peoplecentred approach to the transformation projects carried out in other neighbourhoods in the Netherlands, which often lead to the displacement of the residents.

This unique approach was taken into account in the transformation of the Woensel-West district, and progressed step by step without a master plan or final result. By choosing this approach, a flexible project emerged that was not aimed at a predetermined result but progressed with additions made during the process. The spatial planning approach described as "Because Tastes and Colors Are Different" resulted in a structure that provided a wide area for the development of differences and diversity, thus reflecting the diversity of the neighborhood residents.

At the same time, the use of the richness of form and color, which is more common in the Mediterranean and Caribbean regions, has a liberating effect in terms of architecture. A gradual transformation was achieved in which the Woensel-West residents and facility users were closely involved in every step of the process.

In terms of urban design, an iconic neighborhood building was envisioned, free-standing and without a clear façade orientation. Although the historical reference was inspired by the traditional public building of the 1800s, the "weigh house," a seven-story building resulted in a form that was a bit too large and imposing for the site. Nevertheless, by placing the neighborhood activity area on the square on a glass base and placing a green roof garden on the other side, a beautiful and sculptural form was achieved.

The Waag Woensel-West design stands out with its colors and materials, fully reflecting the diversity of the neighborhood, where half of the residents have an immigrant background.

In order to make this large building look smaller than it is, the extra large windows used are spread over two floors. At the same time, these steel framed windows have different designs on each floor and reflect the characteristics of different layers.

On the ground floor, there is a community activity area, which is an inviting gathering place for the entire neighborhood. All residents can use this space to communicate their concerns, participate in development activities, or simply meet with each other. There are also duplex apartments on the ground floor. Above them are corner apartments overlooking the square. The roof terrace on the building offers a common outdoor living area, while at the top of the tower are apartments with views of Eindhoven.

The building's façade is made of Ecoshapes, a cladding material specially developed as a sustainable alternative to traditional stone façades or plaster. This cladding is an additional highlight that makes the building look even more striking and elegant. Waag Woensel-West marks both the culmination of developments in the area and the beginning of a vibrant future.

According to this, the increase in pressure of winds decreases its temperature and that is why we have taken this type of windows i.e. Recessed windows by which winds entering into the building should be cooler as compared to the outside of building.

The Tectonic Facade and simple color scheme is used which enhances the aesthetic beauty of the building.

XRL Topside Development Kowloon, Hong Kong

Adjacent to the West Kowloon Cultural District, the 3.2 million sq. ft. development above Hong Kong's High Speed Rail West Kowloon Terminus connects established and emerging neighbourhoods with a network of public gardens and landscaped plazas.

Integrating with the station and its rooftop park, the design by Zaha Hadid Architects (ZHA) incorporates civic, office and retail spaces of the highest standards.

At the heart of West Kowloon in Hong Kong, this landmark development is located above the existing West Kowloon Station highspeed rail terminus which has remained in operation throughout construction. As Hong Kong's only station on the Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link, the terminus is a major gateway between Hong Kong and mainland China.

Also adjacent to the Kowloon and Austin stations of Hong Kong's MTR metro network, this new business district integrates with a key section of the 1.5 km landscaped pedestrian West Kowloon Parkway, giving the communities within Kowloon direct access to the harbourside and parks of the West Kowloon Cultural District.

Providing almost 100,000 sq. ft. of garden terraces, plazas and atriums with shopping and dining on its lower five levels, the development incorporates two pairs of interconnected office towers located at both the northern and southern ends of the site. The towers frame a large central plaza with a sculptural pavilion housing panoramic lifts that connect to the levels below. Linking with the West Kowloon Parkway, the plaza incorporates many sheltered outdoor





gathering spaces for relaxation, recreation, and public events.

Complementing the unique geometry of West Kowloon Terminus, the development's composition maximizes outdoor public space and enhances natural ventilation throughout the district, as well as contributes to preventing each tower from being overlooked by its neighbouring building. This configuration also respects the ridgeline of Kowloon's mountains to the north, adhering to height restrictions that maintain the mountain views from across the harbour on Hong Kong Island.

Providing 2.6 million sq. ft of Grade A people-centric workspace in floorplates up to 72,000 sq. ft. that are largely column free and adaptable to current and future work configurations, the towers incorporate floorto-ceiling heights of at least 3m with panoramic views over Hong Kong and access from all floors to planted outdoor terraces for occupants' wellbeing.

Divided into a series of interconnected 'petals' each with a different orientation and height, the towers define a dynamic silhouette on the West Kowloon's skyline. The top of each tower tapers inward to reduce their perceived volume while the façade's vertical shading pleats extend over each rooftop, creating 'halos' that shelter roof terraces and sky gardens.

Interwoven with the new landscaped terraces and civic plaza above the station, the towers also taper inward at lower levels, reducing their footprint to increase outdoor space while encouraging pedestrian circulation and air flow.

Achieving an 'excellent' BREEAM

rating as well as the highest rating of LEED, WELL and HK BEAM Plus precertification, the development incorporates high-performance façades with low thermal transfer values and solar shading fins. Photovoltaic panels integrated at roof level and within the façade will reduce energy demand from the city's electricity grid.

A centralised plant of highefficiency HVAC systems combined with seawater cooling, heat recovery and a smart building management system that automatically monitors and controls services will ensure the highest standards of comfort and air quality with a significant reduction in energy consumption.

Upon completion, global wealth manager UBS will be consolidating their various Hong Kong operations into a tower within the development.

Creating a series of new open spaces for Kowloon's residents and visitors, together with environments for work and leisure designed to enhance wellbeing, this landmark development at the heart of Hong Kong's transport network is defined by its unique location within one of the world's most dynamic cities.

The next step involves gathering the necessary documents. This includes the property agreement, survey documents, title deed, payment receipts for property taxes, current owner details, and other legal documents required for property purchase.

Step 3: Transfer Process

First, transfer the property to the minor's guardian, then transfer it to the minor. Stamp duty must be paid during each registration. In many cases, a minor can be named as the owner in the purchase documentation, but it must be under guardianship, with all documentation and signatures provided by the guardian.

Step 4: Final Registration

After paying stamp duty, visit the sub-registrar's office for the final registration process. As with any property purchase, present the property deed documents along with
two witnesses, their identity proofs, and passport-size photographs.

It's essential to note that the process for registering property under a minor's name may vary depending on specific circumstances. Consulting a legal advisor is strongly recommended to understand the property registration process under a minor's name before proceeding further.

Can the guardian sell the property under the minor's name?

While property acquisition by a minor is possible only through a parent or natural guardian, selling property in a minor's name requires court permission. Section 8(2) of the Hindu Minority and Guardianship Act, 1956, addresses this issue. It states that a minor's immovable property cannot be charged, mortgaged, or transferred by gift, exchange, sale, or any other mode without prior permission from the court. If a natural guardian transfers or sells the immovable property without following clause (2) of Section 8, the sale is deemed void if the minor contests it. The minor can challenge the sale within the limitation period, which starts after he/she turns 18.

Taxation on property owned by minor

According to the Indian Income Tax laws, a minor can hold up to two properties. The minor can benefit from these properties without facing taxation. Income from a gifted property that the minor and his family uses is not taxable. If a property is rented out under a guardian's supervision, a standard deduction of 30% on the rental income applies. A property can be bought under a minor's name only if it is gifted or purchased with the minor's funds, and it is managed by the parents or guardians.

While it is legally possible for a minor to own property in India, the process is governed by strict regulations and requires careful adherence to legal frameworks. Properties can only be acquired by minors through gifts or purchases made with their funds, under the supervision of guardians. Additionally, any sale or transfer of such properties mandates prior court permission to ensure the minor's interests are protected.

• Kitchen:

While preparing the ghar ka naksha, plan on whether you want to go in for an open or closed kitchen. In cities where space constraints are common, families in a ghar ka naksha prefer an open kitchen format, where the doors and walls do not take up extra space. A drawback of this ghar ka naksha format is the challenge of keeping the kitchen presentable at all times. On the other hand, the benefits of this makan ka naksha are more. For example, this ghar ka naksa provides optimum use of space, enhances the appeal and because of this ghar design, it becomes a very utilitarian space.

As per Vastu, the following direction is best-suited for your kitchen. Include it in your ghar ka naksha. Important kitchen Vastu Shastra tips

• Laundry Area

You could use the wash area in Ghar Ka Naksha to wash utensils, or to wash and dry your clothes. If you look at any ghar ka naksha ka photo, you will see the wash area attached to the kitchen or close to it. It is both convenient and practical to design wash area near the kitchen in your makan ka naksha, because there will be sufficient air and light coming into the kitchen and you would not have to bother about an open-to-sky or OTS duct in the wash area.

• Store Room

If you are planning a store room in your house naksha, it is important to consider a few points. A store room in ghar ka naksha is best placed near the kitchen or close to it. The naksha ghar ka should facilitate this unless you are planning a bigger home and have ample space to do so in which case applying the principles of Vastu will be favourable. As per Vastu Shastra, in your home naksha, avoid placing the store room in the east or north. The southwest corner is best for store room in your simple ghar banane ka naksha if you want to store heavy machines or equipment. Generally speaking, both the north-west and the south-west are ideal locations for the store room in your ghar design.

Master Bedroom

According to any ghar ka naksha, this is the biggest bedroom in the house and is to be occupied by the head of the family and his spouse. In your home naksha, when you plan your home, make sure that all bedrooms are in an even size. A simple reason behind planning ghar design in such a way, is that you will not have to cut and resize the tiles when your mason places it. The minimum size of a master bedroom in your naksha ghar ka should be 12 ft x 12 ft, which is the standard size. You can make it bigger if there are no space restrictions according to your ghar ka naksha. An attached toilet and a dresser can be planned in this room while doing your ghar ka naksha online. However, remember in your ghar ke naksha, toilets should not lie close to a kitchen area.

How to Plan a Staircase in Your Home?

In your ghar ka naksha ka photo, the staircase should

always be in a clockwise direction, while ascending the stairs. If you are walking in an anti-clockwise direction, ghar ka naksha design is not ideal. Also, the stairs should always be odd in number a flight of 15, 17, 19, 21 or 23 stairs, etc in your ghar design. The standard size of a stair in a makan naksha is three ft wide, with a six-inch riser and 11-inch tread. The minimum, in most places, is two ft and eight inches (81.3 cms) in a makan ka naksha. In case, a staircase exceeds 44 inches (111.8 cms), then, include handrails in your home naksha

• Dining Area

The best placement for your dining room in your simple ghar ka naksha is close to the kitchen. If you have a staircase in the house, placing your dining room in front of the stairs in the ghar ka naksha is a good idea. It gives a good visual appeal and the space does not look vacant or empty either while designing your ghar ka naksha online. As per Vastu principles, some properties may allow the placement of a dining room just under the staircase, which is a great way to make use of the extra space.

• Drawing Hall or Living Room

To entertain your guests, a drawing-cum-living room is necessary in the ghar ka naksha. Often in makan ka naksha people use the terms drawing hall and living room synonymously but there is a difference. In the ghar ka naksha, a drawing hall is usually at the entrance of your home and for guests who are more of acquaintances. A living room is where you wish to entertain a known guest. Unfamiliar guests need not be brought till the drawing hall and can come to the verandah, designed in the ghar ka naksha.

However, looking at the space constraints in cities, not all home naksha may have these room divisions easily available to them. In case you have the luxury to do so, make sure you plan the ghar ka naksha accordingly.

An electric shock may occur if you touch a live metal component in your electrical system. If you want to avoid it, earthing is a good way to do so. Earthing is accomplished by allowing a fault current to flow safely to the ground through a protective conductor. It also triggers the protection mechanism (the fuse or circuit breaker) to cut power to the faulty circuit.

Electrical earthing refers to discharging excess electrical current directly into the earth through a low-resistance cable. Connecting the equipment's neutral (or the supply system's neutral) to the earth constitutes electrical earthing. If you want the answer to "what is earthing?", then read the article.

Purpose

Earthing is done so that the potential of a currentcarrying conductor does not increase with respect to the earth beyond its intended insulation, preventing electrocution and fires caused by the earth leaking electricity via an undesirable channel.

The metal components of electrical appliances get charged, and static charge builds on them when they come into touch with a live wire, which may happen when the wiring in question is improperly installed, or the cable insulation is damaged. A person receives a shock by touching a charged metal.

Different Earthing Methods for Electrical Systems

- GI (galvanised iron) wire directly connects the system's neutral and the ground, or earth. This kind of earthing is known as neutral earthing or system earthing. Only systems with star winding get this kind of earthing. Electrical appliances have access to earthing equipment. Electrical equipment components that do not generate current, such as the metal frame, are grounded through the conducting wire.
- Pipe earthing is the most effective and cost-effective method of earthing. To create earth electrodes, pipes with a diameter of 38mm and a length of 2 metres are buried vertically in the ground.
- Plate earthing involves burying a copper or GI earthing plate at a depth of more than three metres below grade. An alternate layer of coke and salts protects this earthing plate.
- In transmission procedures, strip earthing is employed. Electrodes are laid in horizontal trenches at least 0.5 metres deep, with a cross-section of 25mm x 1.6mm for copper or 25mm x 4mm for GI or steel.

Beneficial Effects of Grounding

- In the event of a short circuit, earthing will prevent any harm to the workers.
- Even if the insulation fails, earthing still offers the simplest route for short-circuit current to pass.
- Earthing prevents damage to equipment and people from lightning and high voltage surges.
- With correct earthing, metal may be utilised in electrical systems without first checking its conductivity.

Constituents of the earthing infrastructure

The following are the primary parts of an all-inclusive electrical earthing system:

- Earth Continuity Conductor
- Earthing Lead
- Earth Electrode

The term "earth wire" or "earth continuity conductor" refers to the part of the earthing system that connects all of the metals in an electrical installation, such as the conduit, ducts, boxes, metallic shells of the switches, distribution boards, switches, fuses, regulating and controlling devices, metals in electrical machines like motors, generators, and transformers, and the metal framework in which electrical devices and components are installed.

How it occurs?

To achieve earthing, the installation's components are wired to a set of electrodes or electrical wires located in or near the soil. All of the equipment's non-current-carrying metallic elements are linked to the earthing mat or electrode through a flat iron riser buried in the ground. The term "earthing" describes the assembly that makes contact. Electrical connections are the metal wires that go between various components of an installation and the grounding system. The term "earthing system" refers to both the practice and the associated link.

An earthing joint, also known as an "earthing lead," is the connection between the earth's continuous conductor and the earth's electrode or earth plate. The earthing lead is often a hard-drawn, bare copper wire. The earth electrode (earth plat) is linked to the connecting point via an earthing lead after all earth conductors have been connected to common (or many) connecting points.

Two copper wires serve as earthing leads, connecting



the device's metallic body to a ground electrode or earth plate, increasing the installation's safety factor. In other words, there will be four earthing leads if two earth electrodes or earth plates are used. To provide optimal safety, both earth's leads must function effectively to transport fault currents, and it should not be assumed that these leads are utilised as parallel pathways.

The last piece of an electrical earthing system is a metallic electrode or plate that is buried in the ground. The term "earth plate" or "earth electrode" is used to describe the metallic (plate) component of the earthing system that is buried underground and linked to earthing lead.
